

# **ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR TRINITY SUNDAY • JUNE 15**

**TODAY** is Trinity Sunday, the first Sunday after the Day of Pentecost. Like Pentecost, Trinity Sunday is one of the seven principal feasts of the Church. It celebrates the understanding of the one God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. According to the *Episcopal Dictionary of the Church*, "Trinity means 'threefold unity'... a perfect relationship of love in which neither unity nor distinctness of the divine persons is compromised."

**NEW LEADERSHIP** Canon Ashley Freeman has circulated questionnaires to begin the search process for a new rector. Please, give this our attention. Jo+ and Jim+ will retire later this year, and we all are part of the process to find new leadership.

NOON WEDNESDAY SERVICE As your priests, one of our disappointments in having no physical church is that we have had to postpone our Noon Healing services on Wednesdays. Let us think outside the box about how and where we might continue this lovely habit of praying out loud for those who need our prayers. And we could also continue to do our Bible study, spiritual disciple practice, or book study after that service over lunch together. Let's find a way to do this and feed one another spiritually and physically.

RENEWING HOPE Three years ago on Trinity Sunday we were in a process of reflection and discernment to evaluate our ministries at St. Andrew's By-the-Sea. We had learned to "hear and listen" and "listen and hear" to what the Holy Spirit is calling us to do. Now our beloved church and property has been sold, but we are still "the church" worshipping at the Destin Community Center setting up worship services out of two rolling suitcases. Praise God, we have stuck together in this new reality of worshipping in the diaspora.

WHAT'S NEXT? Bishop Russell was with us on Pentecost and led a "Town Hall" after service. In his sermon he suggested we pause and take stock of who we are and who we want to be as a church. A six-month period of discernment would indeed be helpful. Here are some questions he gave to everyone. If we had to start over with nothing but each other and the Spirit:

- Where and how would we begin again; what would we do?
- What do we really need (versus want) to be church?
- If Jesus started a church in our community today, what would it look like?
- What does a season of waiting look like?
- What is God's dream for our church?
   (Which is exactly what we discussed for many weeks three years ago.)

If we recall our goals outlined after much deliberation over months of prayer and discussion were threefold: 1) continue our outreach to the community, 2) maintain our presence on Highway 98 in Destin, and 3) offer meaningful worship. Are those goals still applicable? What other goals might enjoy prominence in our discernment today? For example, what would be the impact on our existing level of attendance, involvement, and pledge income? How would a new opportunities location offer for congregational growth and/or development of new ministries? Would it help us attract a larger pool of candidates for a new rector? Would it allow flexibility and space for development of new ministries? Would it be affordable? Would it be attractive to new clienteles or demographics? Are the facilities accessible given our ethos of inclusion?
